Learning in groups: Curriculum considerations for children with autism

Early intensive intervention programs for children with autism start with instruction presented in a one-to-one format, with an adult and a child. If learning is progressive however, we must help children with autism eventually acquire new information within group contexts. This presentation will review research-based strategies to increase responding within a group instructional contexts as well as procedures to increase observational learning of children with autism within these contexts. Video-taped examples will be used to illustrate instructional strategies.

1. Identify why learning in a group may be challenging for children with autism.
2. Identify the components of observational learning.
3. Identify research-based procedures that could be implemented within a group to increase rate of responding.
