Presenter Biography

Cresse Morrell holds a Master's Degree of Science from the University of North Texas and is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA). She has delivered multiple research based presentations at national and international conferences and served as a board member and co-conference planning committee member for the Virginia Association of Behavior Analysis. Cresse began working with students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) at Milestones when the school opened in 1997 serving first as an Instructional Assistant, Behavior Analyst and finally, Assistant Clinical Director. While at Milestones, she participated in the launching of a school in New Hampshire, ultimately taking the role of Clinical Director and serving as part of a leadership team as the school grew from 3 to 19 students. Prior to returning to Milestones, Cresse held multiple positions leading teams of professionals in developing and implementing evidence based intervention for students with ASD as well as developing agency-wide protocols and procedures for large scale change, and training systems for parents and staff. Cresse has also worked directly with public school administration at building and district levels to coordinate and implement appropriate and effective educational services.
